Friar Lawrence's actions have a big impact on how the plot of *Romeo* and *Juliet* plays out. Some people think that he is to blame for the deaths of the two lovers at the end of the play. Prince Escalus makes it clear in his final speech that there are some questions of guilt and responsibility that still need answering, but he leaves this to a time after the play has ended.
